The Chesapeake Bay Field Lab is sponsoring a two-day Needlework and Fiber Arts Conference April 3rd and 4th at the Harry Lundeberg School of Seamanship, Paul Hall Center Hotel in Piney Point.

The overnight conference includes classes, demonstrations and speakers as well as opportunities for individuals as well as needle-working groups to complete special projects – for example, the Chesapeake Bay Field Lab will be making skipjack pins during project time. We also encourage bringing a UFO.

Organizations already sewing, knitting, crocheting and/or needle-working for charitable goals are encouraged to contact the conference manager for any special accommodations needed to help complete or plan upcoming projects. Individuals can take this opportunity to meet an array of organizations that are needle-working for charity and individual projects are welcome as well.

Tables can be made available for needle-working charitable organizations to showcase and sell their products. Vendors are also welcome. Please contact the conference manager Becky Benton for details.

The Chesapeake Bay Field Lab is a nonprofit outdoor educational facility dedicated to passing the heritage of the Chesapeake Bay onto future generations. The field lab carries more than 5,000 students a year into the St. Mary's River aboard the skipjack the Dee of St. Mary's and conducts additional environmental and social science classes from the Sea-Fruit Oyster House and marsh walk on St. George Island. Students and schools cannot afford the full cost of running such a hands-on field lab.
